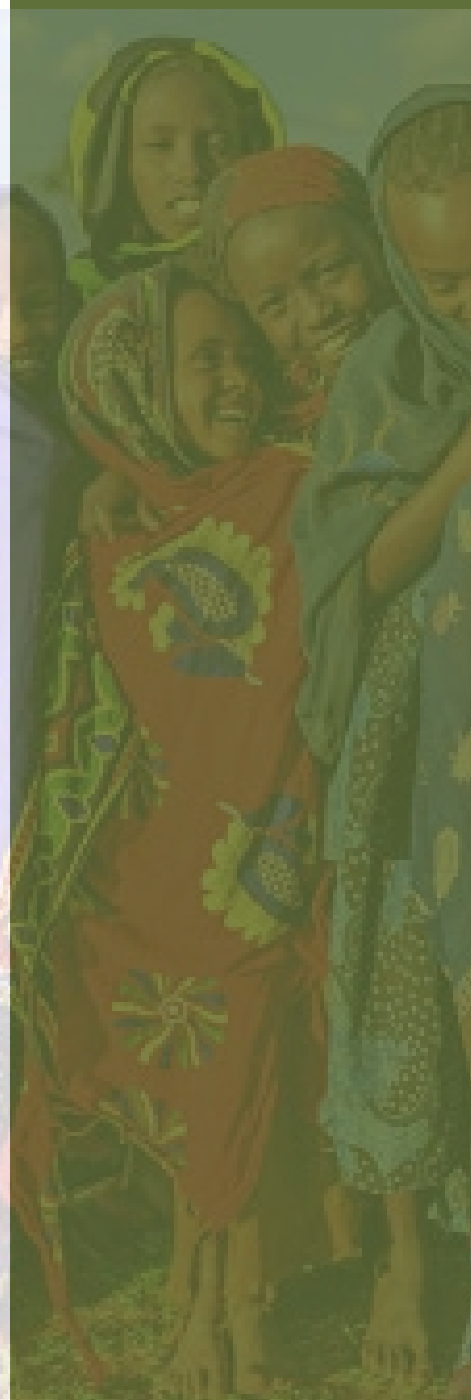

The evaluation generated evidence and policy recommendations to strengthen programme delivery and guide future investments in maternal and child wellbeing.

Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN)

The project evaluated the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) Workforce Nutrition (WFN) Global Programme, which aimed to improve the nutrition and diet diversity of women and children among tea workers and smallholder farming households in India, Kenya, and Malawi. The assignment established the programme's monitoring and evaluation framework and assessed its impact on nutrition outcomes to inform evidence-based programme delivery.

Developed the programme's Theory of Change (ToC), results framework, and key performance indicators (KPIs) to guide implementation and performance measurement.



CONDUCTING IMPACT EVALUATIONS

APPLYING ROBUST EVALUATION METHODS

Used a pre-post evaluation design and Propensity Score Matching (PSM) to estimate programme impact and strengthen the credibility of evaluation findings.

The project evaluated the Keeping Food Markets Working (KFMW) programme, implemented by the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) with support from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands. Designed as an emergency response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the programme aimed to strengthen food systems by supporting food system workers, small and medium enterprises, and fresh food markets. The evaluation assessed programme performance and generated evidence to inform more resilient food systems programming

Assessed the design, implementation, and overall performance of the KFMW portfolio against its objectives and targets.



ASSESSING FOOD SYSTEM RESILIENCE
